Commentary and Analysis:

Southview School continues to provide quality instruction as indicated by our Education Quality Measure. In all areas, we are performaing in the very high or excellent category. We have improved in three measures. Although higher parent repondents than in previous years, to gain a more robust parent perspective, it ould be beneficial for to have more parents responses. Our focus on impactful instructional strategies including small group instruction, UFLI, Building Thinking Classrooms, and Teacher Clarity could contribute to these improved results. Additionally, our intentional focus on social emotional learning and maintaining an inclusive, welcoming culture likely contributes to our improved scores in the areas of citizenship, student learning engagement, and welcoming, caring, respectful and safe learning environments. Throughout the 2023-2024 school year, there was an intentional focus on providing new opportunities for students. The addition of lunch clubs and Grade 4-6 student leadership provided engaging opportunities for students to connect with one another as well as with school staff. Our school-side positive behaviour matrix continues to clarity around expectations and recognizes students for positive behaviour. The addition of the Seven Sacred Teachings provided an additional opportunity for student recognition and parent involvement in monthly assemblies. The improvement in our results reflect the dedication and care our teachers put into planning and implementing impactful instructional strategies and assessment practice as well as their inclusive approach to supporting students.

Commentary and Analysis: Our staff's dedication to providing quality social emotional learning opportunities through the Second Step program, positive behaviour support matrix (PAWS), and the addition of the Seven Sacred Teachings could contribute to our improved score. Each month students are recognized from each class for demonstrating the values of the Seven Sacred Teaching. This is a great opportunity for parents to come into the school to celebrate their child's accomplishments. Additionally, each week a student is recognized for demonstrating PAWS. The implementation of a student leadership team may have also contributed to the improvement in this area. Students from Grades 4-6 who are on the student leadership team meet weekly to implement ideas that contribute and bring joy to the school and community.

Commentary and Analysis: Student learning and engagement was a focus for the 2023-2024 school year. Teachers worked through the *Teacher Clarity* and *Success Criteria Playbook* to increase clarity around learning intentions and success criteria. During professional learning days, staff focused on increasing their understanding and are in the beginning stages of implementing these components in their classrooms. When students understand what they are learning, why, and the steps to get there, their engagement increases. Furthermore, teachers implemented small group instruction informed by data to meet the needs of all students. The focus on utilizing assessment to inform practice could contribute to our scores in this area. To engage parents in their children's learning, teachers maintain communication through Edsby, ISP meetings, and Parent-Teacher Interviews/Student-led Conferences.

PAT Results— Southview School's Social Studies PAT results are consistent with previous years, showing a slight decrease in the percentage of students achieving acceptable standards but an increase in those achieving excellence. While the school's overall achievement is below division and provincial averages, it remains committed to leveraging assessment and triangulated data to inform practice. The Grade 6 Science PAT was not written this year due to the classroom's participation in piloting the new Science curriculum. Over the past two years, Southview has prioritized research-based instructional practices, focusing on clearly identifying and communicating learning intentions and success criteria to help students understand their learning objectives and pathways to success. This focus will continue alongside providing targeted feedback to enhance student achievement and growth.

Soft start, Connection Corner, and embedded community building at the beginning of each day may contribute to this improvement. Our focus on teaching skills explicitly through Second Step, PAWS, and Seven Sacred Teachings might contribute to the improvement in this area. When conflict arises, we model and support restorative conversations between students and develop proactive plans collaboratively.

We continue to value a collaborative approach at Southview School to ensure students and families receive the support they require.
